# **Large Animal Ambulatory Protocols**

# Arriving at the Farm Protocol

The following are the suggested general protocols upon arrival at the farm:

- 1. Know and respect your client's bio-security expectations. Train staff to inquire when appointment is booked.
- 2. Shower in out if one is available and is the farmer's protocol.
- 3. Pens and other inexpensive equipment can be taken into and left on the farm.
- 4. On cattle farms they often do not have the equipment needed. (i.e. ropes, calving equipment). Try to keep them "clean".
- 5. Ensure equipment required at the farm is clean before leaving vehicle.
- 6. Inform the farmer of your arrival.

## **Entering the Barn Protocol**

When entering the barn, follow these suggested protocols as well as the farm's biosecurity protocols:

- 1. Sign time and date producer's logbook if they have one.
- 2. Clean hands thoroughly with hand sanitizer or sanitizer soap.
- 3. Change into any boots, coveralls or gloves that the producer provides.
- 4. Hang raincoat or winter coat in non livestock area.
- If a Foreign Animal Disease or serious endemic or zoonotic disease is suspected, consider using disposable gloves, Tyvek coveralls, hair-cover and a mask from your emergency kit.
- 6. Take only the required equipment, sampling kits, recording devices into the barn.
- 7. Consider protective coverings that are left on the farm for equipment that must be in the livestock area e.g. ultrasound equipment.
- 8. Look for a clean, dry and elevated area to place medical equipment and cases.
- 9. If a return to the vehicle is necessary, do not enter the vehicle with your boots on and ensure that, when re-entering the animal facilities, your clothing and boots are clean.

# **Examining the Animals or Birds Protocol**

- When possible, plan your examinations from youngest to oldest or healthiest to sickest.
- ☑ Isolate used equipment from the "clean" equipment.
- If ropes are required, use the farmer's ropes if they are suitable.

Encourage producers to have their own equipment such as ropes, calf pullers, hog snares, etc.

# Leaving the Barn and the Farm Protocol

When preparing to leave:

- 1. Knock off any visible debris from attire or equipment
- 2. Using the nearby water supply, clean attire and equipment
- 3. Wash and sanitize cleanable equipment and replace in vehicle
- 4. Place non-cleanable equipment in dirty area of vehicle
- 5. Clean non-washable equipment such as laptops, clipboards, blackberries, etc. with disinfectant wipes
- 6. Remove coveralls, gloves and any other PPE
- 7. Clean scrub brush in pail of water and spray with disinfectant or sanitizer soap
- 8. Clean and disinfect exterior of test kits. Place samples (vials, tissues) in a clean outer jacket
- 9. Obtain a pail of water for final cleaning of boots; remove boots before entering
- 10. Wash hands thoroughly in hand sanitizer
- 11. Keep the inside of the vehicle as a clean zone and the trunk or back as the dirty zone
- 12. Drive slowly and avoid visible debris
- 13. When returning to your veterinary facility, follow the Return to Clinic Protocol.
